


IX. THE LORD'S FINAL DAYS AT JERUSALEM BEFORE THE CROSS

(4th day of the week) Wed. April 3, 30 AD Every day Jesus went to the Temple to teach, and each evening he returned to spend the night on the Mount of Olives. The crowds gathered at the Temple early each morning to hear him.

When Jesus had finished saying all these things, he said to his disciples, "As you know, Passover begins in two days, and the Son of Man will be handed over to be crucified."






The crowds gathered at the Temple early each morning to hear him.

IX. THE LORD'S FINAL DAYS AT JERUSALEM BEFORE THE CROSS


Thur. April 4, 30 AD

On the first day of the Festival of Unleavened Bread, when the Passover lamb is sacrificed, the disciples came to Jesus and asked, "Where do you want us to prepare the Passover meal for you?"

Jesus sent Peter and John ahead and said, "Go and prepare the Passover meal, so we can eat it together."

"Where do you want us to prepare it?" they asked him.


"As you go into the city, as soon as you enter Jerusalem," he told them, "you will see a certain man carrying a pitcher of water that will meet you. 

Jesus replied, "You don't understand now what I am doing, but someday you will."


"No," Peter protested, "you will never ever wash my feet!"




Jesus replied, "Unless I wash you, you won't belong to me."






Jesus responded, "It is the one to whom I give the bread I dip in the bowl." And when he had dipped it, he gave it to Judas, son of Simon Iscariot.

When Judas had eaten the bread, Satan entered into him. Judas, the one who would betray him, also asked, "Rabbi, am I the one?"


And Jesus told him, "You have said it." Then Jesus told him, "Hurry and do what you're going to do."



Simon Peter asked, "Lord, where are you going?"


And Jesus replied, "You can't go with me now, but you will follow me later."

Peter declared, "Even if everyone else deserts you, I will never desert you."





And all the others vowed the same.




Then Jesus asked them, "When I sent you out to preach the Good News and you did not have money, a traveler's bag, or an extra pair of sandals, did you need anything?"

"That's enough," he said.



"No, we don't know, Lord," Thomas said. "We have no idea where you are going, so how can we know the way?"



Philip said, "Lord, show us the Father, and we will be satisfied."






"If you love me, obey my commandments. And I will ask




Judas (not Judas Iscariot, but the other disciple with that name) said to him, "Lord, why are you going to reveal yourself only to us and not to the world at large?"






"I am the true grapevine, and my Father is the gardener. He cuts off every branch of mine that doesn't produce fruit, and he prunes the branches that do bear fruit so they will produce even more. You have already been pruned and purified by the message I have given you. Remain in me, and I will remain in you. For a branch cannot produce fruit if it is severed from the vine, and you cannot be fruitful unless you remain in me.

"Yes, I am the vine; you are the branches. Those who remain in me, and I in them, will produce much fruit. For apart from me you can do nothing. Anyone who does not remain in me is thrown away like a useless branch and withers. Such branches are gathered into a pile to be burned. But if you remain in me and my words remain in you, you may ask for anything you want, and it will be granted! When you produce much fruit, you are my true disciples. This brings great glory to my Father.



"I have loved you even as the Father has loved me. Remain in my love. When you obey my commandments, you remain in my love, just as I obey my Father's commandments and remain in his love.


"I have told you these things so that you will be filled with my joy. Yes, your joy will overflow! This is my commandment: Love each other in the same way I have loved you. There is no greater love than to lay down one's life for one's friends. You are my friends if you do what I command. I no longer call you slaves because a master doesn't confide in his slaves. Now you are my friends, since I have told you everything the Father told me. You didn't choose me. I chose you. I appointed you to go and produce lasting fruit, so that the Father will give you whatever you ask for, using my name. This is my command: Love each other.



"If the world hates you, remember that it hated me first. The world would love you as one of its own if you belonged to it, but you are no longer part of the world. I chose you to come out of the world, so it hates you.

"Do you remember what I told you? 'A slave is not greater than the master.' Since they persecuted me, naturally they will persecute you. And if they had listened to me, they would listen to you. They will do all this to you because of me, for they have rejected the one who sent me. They would not be guilty if I had not come and spoken to them. But now they have no excuse for their sin.


"Anyone who hates me also hates my Father. If I hadn't done such miraculous signs among them that no one else could do, they would not be guilty. But as it is, they have seen everything I did, yet they still hate me and my Father. This fulfills what is written in their Scriptures: 'They hated me without cause.'



"But I will send you the Advocate - the Spirit of truth. He will come to you from the Father and will testify all about me. And you must also testify about me because you have been with me from the beginning of my ministry.

"I have told you these things so that you won't abandon your faith. For you will be expelled from the synagogues, and the time is coming when those who kill you will think they are doing a holy service for God. This is because they have never known the Father or me. Yes, I'm telling you these things now, so that when they happen, you will remember my warning. I didn't tell you earlier because I was going to be with you for a while longer.


"But now I am going away to the one who sent me, and not one of you is asking where I am going. Instead, you grieve because of what I've told you. But in fact, it is best for you that I go away, because if I don't, the Advocate won't come. If I do go away, then I will send him to you.



"And when he comes, he will convict the world of its sin, and of God's righteousness, and of the coming judgment. The world's sin is that it refuses to believe in me. Righteousness is available because I go to the Father, and you will see me no more. Judgment will come because the ruler of this world has already been judged.


"There is so much more I want to tell you, but you can't bear it now. When the Spirit of truth comes, he will guide you into all truth. He will not speak on his own but will tell you what he has heard. He will tell you about the future. He will bring me glory by telling you whatever he receives from me. "In a little while you won't see me anymore. But a little while after that, you will see me again."










Then his disciples said, "At last you are speaking plainly and not figuratively. Now we understand that you know everything, and there's no need to question you. From this we believe that you came from God."

He told them, "My soul is crushed with grief to the point of death. Stay here and keep watch with me. Pray that you will not give in to temptation."





Jesus fully realized all that was going to happen to him, so he stepped forward to meet them. "Who are you looking for?" he asked.


"Jesus the Nazarene," they replied.




So the soldiers, their commanding officer, and the Temple guards arrested Jesus and tied him up.



In that same hour, Jesus said to the crowd leading priests, the captains of the Temple guard, and the elders who had come for him. "Am I some dangerous revolutionary," he asked, "that you come with swords and clubs to arrest me? Why didn't you arrest me in the Temple? I was there every day. But this is all happening to fulfill the words of the prophets as recorded in the Scriptures - these things are happening to fulfill what the Scriptures say about me. This is your moment, the time when the power of darkness reigns."


At that point, all the disciples deserted him and fled. One young man following behind was clothed only in a long linen shirt. When the mob tried to grab him, he slipped out of his shirt and ran away naked.


